

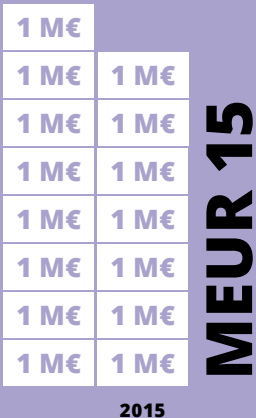
FINLAND'S SUPPORT TO SYRIA AND ITS NEIGHBOURING AREAS

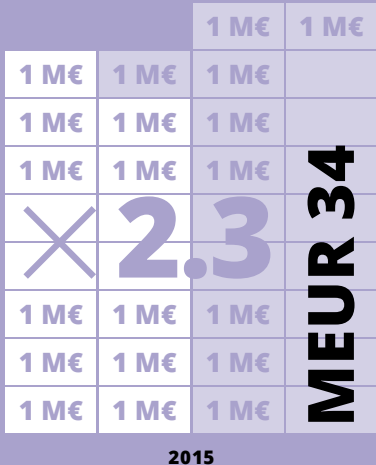

FINLAND'S PLEDGE WILL RISE BY 60% IN 2016 Finland's pledge to Syria and its neighbouring areas

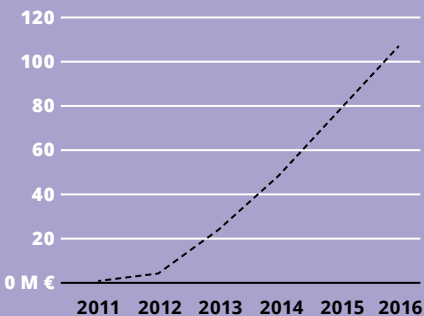


THE PLEDGE MADE IN 2015 HAS MORE THAN DOUBLED Finland's final support to the victims of the Syria conflict



FINLAND'S SUPPORT TOTALS OVER EUR 100 MILLION

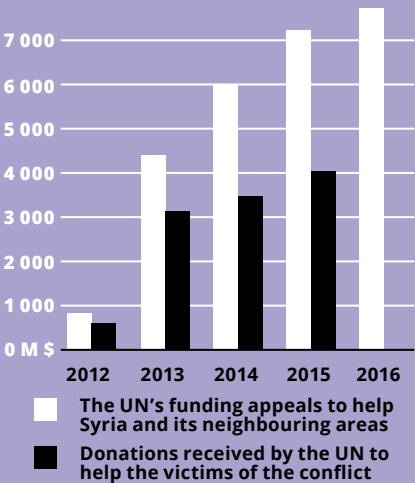
IN CUMULATIVE TERMS, THE SUPPORT TO SYRIA IN 2011-2016



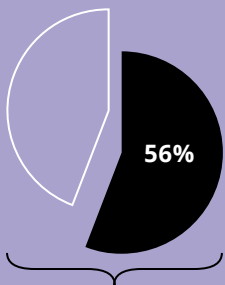
