Ensuring the participation of women in conflict prevention as well as peace processes and post-conflict rehabilitation is critical to achieving sustainable peace and addressing the needs of *all* affected by conflict. UN Security Council Resolution 1325 is a landmark call to action in this respect. Especially in the area of peace measures, women have been excluded and, as a result, their issues have not been addressed adequately in post conflict rebuilding efforts. During this side event, speakers will emphasize the importance of involving women in formal peace talks as well as other connected peace initiatives, describe their first hand experience in post-conflict rehabilitation, and encourage OSCE participating States to address these issues in national policies either with respect to conflict that has happened on their territory or within the territories of other nations. Speakers will highlight challenges that are still to be met and provide recommendations for the way forward.
