  United Nations Security Council Resolution 1325 for Women, Peace and Security.

   Major General Kristin Lund of Norway is the Force Commander of the United Nations Peacekeeping
   Force in Cyprus (UNFICYP). Major General Lund has had a distinguished military career, with more
   than 34 years of military command and staff experience at the national and international levels.

  Elisabeth Rehn is a member of the Board of Directors of the International Criminal Court (ICC) Trust

  Fund for Victims in The Hague and of the UN Women High Level Advisory Group for the Global Review

  world's first female Minister of Defense between 1990 and 1995.

   President of Ireland from 1990-1997 and UN High Commissioner for Human Rights from 1997-2002.
